Sessions Breakdown

Following is the Sessions Breakdown for the A2 Integrated Course at EuroBhasha. It serves as a comprehensive guide to assist you in tracking the topics covered throughout the progression of the A2 Integrated Batch.

Session 1 (Grammar) Unterschied zwischen wer/wen/wem; 12 Formen von welch

In this session, we learn the difference between 'who' and 'whom' in German and 12 forms of W-Questions 'which'. These concepts are related to the concepts of Nominativ/Akkusativ/Dativ.

Session 2 (Interactive German: Part 1) W-Fragen und Ja Nein Fragen

In this session, we practice the usage of W-Questions and Yes/No Questions. Along with this, we revise the different types of verbs (irregular verbs, separable verbs, dative verbs, modal verbs)

Session 3 (Interactive German: Part 2) Tagesablauf

In this session, we learn about how to tell one's daily schedule. We discuss the fixed prepositions with day/month/time/date etc. We read the daily schedules of some people. Then, we write our daily schedule using different types of verbs.

Session 4 (Grammar) Partizip Perfekt

This is the highlight of the A2 Course. In this session, we learn the usage of past tense. In German, there are two past tenses - Partizip Perfekt and Präteritum. We learn Partizip Perfekt in this session. Partizip Perfekt is used much more than the other past tense.

Session 5 (Interactive German: Part 3) Selbstvorstellung und Fragen mit Partizip Perfekt

Here, we listen to how people introduce themselves in German. We learn how to tell about our past experiences by using Partizip Perfekt. Then, we prepare our introduction where we use Present, Past, and Future Tense.

Session 6 (Interactive German: Part 4) Umzug nach Deutshland

The theme of this session is 'Shifting to Germany'. We read a couple of texts about this topic and build our vocabulary. After this session, we should be able to talk/write about our experience of coming to Germany, the challenges, and the benefits.

Session 7 (Grammar) Reflexive Verben

In this session, we learn a new type of verb in German: Reflexive Verbs. Reflexive verbs are those actions that we do to ourselves. Many reflexive verbs are used frequently in day-to-day life. We learn them and add many new words to our vocabulary.



Session 8 (Interactive German: Part 5) Verabredung/Termine vereinbaren

This is a very special session. Here, we learn how to set up dates with friends and how to fix an appointment. We learn the kind of sentences used in such context with examples from different spheres of day-to-day life in Germany.

Session 9 (Interactive German: Part 6) Verkehr in Deutschland

In this session, we read a text and learn about the different modes of transport in Germany. We discuss the differences between modes of transport in Germany and our homeland. This session helps us increase vocabulary related to travelling from one place to another.

Session 10 (Grammar) Konnektoren

One of the most important sessions: here, we learn an extensive list of connectors in German. We learn which connectors we can use whenever we want to make compound sentences in German. These connectors enrich our daily experience of speaking German.

Session 11 (Interactive German: Part 7) Reisen; Konnektoren Übung

The theme of this session is Reisen (Travelling). We learn how to book a hotel room or how to make a conversation if we want to book tickets for our travel. With this, we also practice the usage of connectors in German.



Session 12 (Interactive German: Part 8) Einkaufen; Konnektoren Übung

This session is about 'Shopping in Germany'. We hear and observe conversations at different places of Shopping like clothing stores, shoe stores, grocery markets, etc. Then, we use phrases from these conversations to make a similar conversation with our partner in the class. We also practice connectors in this session.

Session 13 (Grammar) Modalverben Präteritum

Here, we learn the past tense of modal verbs in German. We learn words like could, had to, wanted, liked, among others. The past tense of modal verbs is used very often in daily life, so they are quite important.

Session 14 (Interactive German: Part 9) Berufe und Büro

This session is dedicated to improving our vocabulary of office and profession-related words in German. We read a text about the different professions pursued in Germany. Also, we work on our vocabulary related to the objects used in offices.

Session 15 (Interactive German: Part 10) Schule und Kindheit

A very interesting session that refreshes our memories of school and childhood. We learn about how to talk about our childhood and school days. We see how useful the past form of modal verbs can be in such conversations.



Session 16 (Grammar) Zu + Infinitiv – zwei Hauptverben im Satz

This is the highlight of the A2 level. Here, you learn how to use two main verbs in a sentence. Till now, you make sentences using one main verb only. With this session, you learn how to use more than one main verb in a sentence. This knowledge immensely helps us in constructing complicated sentences in German.

Session 17 (Interactive German: Part 11) Im Restaurant

This session is dedicated to building vocabulary related to the eating habits and food options in Germany. We compare the eating habits of Germans with those of people in our homeland. We also learn how to order something at a restaurant.

Session 18 (Interactive German: Part 12) zu + Infintiv Übung

This session is dedicated to the practice of zu + Infinitiv. It is very often that we use more than one main verb in a sentence. In this session, we equip ourselves with rules to apply whenever we have to make a complicated sentence with more than one main verb.

Session 19 (Grammar) Adjektive Endungen

In this session, we learn a much-feared topic in German: Adjective Endings. It is indeed one of the most mind-boggling topics. But it is at the same time very useful to learn it as we use so many adjectives in our day-to-day lives.



Session 20 (Interactive German: Part 13) Etwas organiseren

How to make a conversation whenever we plan an event is the topic of this session. In our daily lives, we need to plan many events like parties, gatherings, meetings, picnics, and visits to a friend in the hospital, among other things. We learn the phrases that we can use in such planning.

Session 21 (Interactive German: Part 14) Adjectives Endungen Übung

As Adjective Endings are a difficult topic, we dedicate this class completely to the practice of adjective endings. We learn many new adjectives. We discuss different scenarios where one uses adjectives, for example, while talking about someone's or something's appearance. We do exercises related to adjective endings.

Session 22 (Grammar) Komparativ/Superlativ

We have already learned adjectives. Now, we learn how to use adjectives in comparative and superlative forms. These two forms are used whenever we are comparing two things or a large set of objects. Learning comparative and superlative enables us to easily express ourselves whenever we are talking about many things at once.

Session 23 (Interactive German: Part 15) Wohnen

The topic of this class is Wohnen (Living). Here, you read texts about the comparison of lifestyle between the city and the countryside. We also discuss the benefits and disadvantages of living alone and living with others. This session improves vocabulary and speaking.



Session 24 (Interactive German: Part 16) Partizip Perfekt / Konnektoren und zu+Infinitiv Übung

In this session, we refresh our concepts and revise the three most important concepts learnt till now: Past Tense, connectors and zu + Infnitiv.

Session 25 (Grammar) Konnektoren am Anfang

Here, we learn a very interesting thing. In almost every language, it is possible to start a sentence with a connector. In German, the sentence structure is greatly affected whenever we use a connector in the first part of the sentence. We learn about it in this session.

Session 26 (Interactive German: Part 17) (Konnektor am Anfang Übung)

Starting sentences with a connector is a skill that can help you greatly in making interesting conversations about almost everything. They need a lot of practice. So, this session is dedicated to practising how to use a connector at the beginning of sentences. We do this by building sentences about different spheres/situations of life.

Session 27 (Interactive German: Part 18) Arbeit und Büro

This session is dedicated to the vocabulary used in the office and during work. We listen to office-related telephonic conversations and create our conversations in the session. This session gives you a working vocabulary for day-to-day work in offices.



Session 28 (Grammar) Präteritum

Toward the end of A2 Integrated Course, we learn the last topic: the second past tense in German - Präteritum. This past tense is generally used in newspaper or magazine articles, history books, story-telling, etc. We learn how and when to use Präteritum in German.

Session 29 (Interactive German: Part 19) Über sich selbst sprechen mit Präteritum

In this session, we read many texts and listen to conversations where people talk about themselves, their childhood, and history by using Präteritum. We learn and practice telling about our childhood and history, thereby making use of Präteritum.

Session 30 (Interactive German: Part 20) Brief/E-Mail schreiben

In this final session, we practice letter and e-mail writing. We learn both formal and informal letters. We learn the format of these letters, read some sample letters, and write our own in the class.
