"At the B1 level, students gain proficiency in constructing complex sentences using connectors and the "zu + Infinitive" construction. They also acquire the ability to employ sophisticated structures and phrases in German for their everyday interactions. This stage emphasizes understanding the distinction between active and passive voice, formal letter writing, and engaging in formal conversations. Additionally, students expand their vocabulary by learning numerous verbs with fixed prepositions.

Upon completing B1, students are equipped to actively participate in conversations with native German speakers."

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Sessions Breakdown

Following is the session breakdown for the B1 Integrated Course at EuroBhasha. It serves as a comprehensive guide to assist you in tracking the topics covered throughout the progression of the B1 Integrated Batch.

Session 1 (Grammar) Relativsatz

In this session, we delve into a distinctive feature of the German language: the Relative Sentence. These sentences employ definite articles (der/die/das/den/dem) as connectors, offering a unique structure that is widely employed in everyday communication. Mastering relative sentences is crucial for fluency, given their frequent usage in daily interactions.

Session 2 (Interactive German: Part 1) Relativsatz und Konnektoren Übung

This session focuses on mastering the use of Relativsatz and connectors in German. These linguistic tools allow us to express complex ideas concisely and enrich our German language skills. By understanding and employing connectors effectively, we can elevate the sophistication of our German communication significantly.

Session 3 (Interactive German: Part 2) Einander kennenlernen

In this session, we focus on improving our speaking skills in German, particularly when meeting new people. We analyze sample conversations and then practice our dialogues, aiming to go beyond basic introductions. Our goal at the B1 level is to engage in more detailed conversations.

Session 4 (Grammar) Präteritum

In this session, we delve into the Präteritum, the second past tense in German. Präteritum finds its common usage in storytelling, narration, historical accounts, as well as newspaper and magazine articles. We explore the Präteritum forms of various verbs and practice constructing sentences with them. By doing so, we become adept at incorporating Präteritum into both formal and everyday conversations.

Session 5 (Interactive German: Part 3) Präteritum und zu+Infinitiv Übung

This session is dedicated to practising the Präteritum tense in German. Mastering Präteritum verbs requires practice and repetition for effective memorization. We engage in reading texts featuring Präteritum usage and complete exercises to reinforce our understanding. Additionally, we practice incorporating the construction of zu + Infinitiv into our sentences.

Session 6 (Interactive German: Part 4) Berühmte Menschen

In this session, we read a biographical text about a famous German personality. We observe the usefulness of the Präteritum tense in narrating someone's life story. Subsequently, we employ Präteritum in crafting our text about a famous personality of our choice.

Session 7 (Grammar) Verben mit festen Präpositionen (W Fragen)

This session is crucial in our German course as we delve into the relationship between verbs and prepositions. Exploring this extensive list will significantly enrich our vocabulary. Additionally, we encounter a new set of interrogative words in German during this session.

Session 8 (Interactive German: Part 5) Verben mit festen Präpositionen Übung

In this session, we'll focus on practising the usage of verbs with fixed prepositions. By reading texts and engaging in exercises, we'll solidify our understanding of these fixed structures, aiding in better retention and application.

Session 9 (Interactive German: Part 6) Gespräche bei der Arbeit und im Büro

In this session, we listen to several telephone conversations and learn appropriate phrases for making calls in an office setting. Additionally, we discover how colleagues can communicate with each other in a formal and respectful manner. Furthermore, we engage in a speaking exercise where we role-play various scenarios and create our own dialogues.

Session 10 (Grammar) Da Wörter (beide Funktionen)

In this session, we delve into the realm of da-words in German, such as daran, damit, darüber, darauf, dazu, and others. These words serve to enhance the sophistication and elegance of our German language. We explore two functions associated with these five words, allowing us to refine our language skills.

Session 11 (Interactive German: Part 7) Partner und Beziehungen

One of the intriguing sessions in this course focuses on the significance of partnerships and relationships in our lives. We delve into a text that explores people's desires in a partner, prompting us to compare it with our thoughts. Do desires for partners vary across the globe? What are the essential characteristics of a good partner? Let's engage in discussion and explore these questions further.



Session 12 (Interactive German: Part 8) Konnektor am Anfang Übung

In this session, we review a grammar topic commonly used in everyday life: starting sentences with connectors. Through various exercises and speaking tasks, we reinforce our understanding of this topic. The objective is to incorporate useful vocabulary and sentences into our daily German usage.

Session 13 (Grammar) Genitiv und Genitive Präpositionen

An essential session in the B1 level curriculum focuses on the usage of the Genitiv case in German. Having already mastered the Nominativ, Akkusativ, and Dativ cases, we delve into the intricacies of Genitiv in this session.

Session 14 (Interactive German: Part 9) Genitiv Übung

This session is dedicated to the practice of the Genitiv case. We read texts and engage in exercises where Genitiv is utilized, with genitive prepositions playing a significant role. Through this practice, we learn many sentences that can be applied in our day-to-day life in Germany.

Session 15 (Interactive German: Part 10)

Argar's session, we explore the factors that trigger feelings of anger, happiness, or sadness. We also learn how to express ourselves in German when experiencing annoyance or delight.

Session 16 (Grammar)

Passiv

A pivotal aspect of the B1 level curriculum is the introduction of the Passive Voice in German. Up until now, our focus has been on constructing active sentences. However, in this session, we delve into the concept of passive sentences, wherein the action occurs but the doer of the action is not explicitly mentioned. We learn how to form passive sentences in German.

Session 17 (Interactive German: Part 11) Passiv Übung

This session is entirely devoted to practicing the Passive Voice. As you may have noticed, mastering the passive requires ample practice and time. We engage in solving exercises, practicing the passive construction, and learning useful passive sentences.

Session 18 (Interactive German: Part 12) Meldungen und Nachrichten

In this session, we focus on learning vocabulary related to news and notices in German. When listening to news or reading notices, certain words are frequently used. We learn and incorporate such words into our vocabulary to enhance our understanding of news, announcements, and notices whenever we encounter them.

Session 19 (Grammar) Sich im Dativ ; indem als Konnektor

In this session, we expand our understanding of reflexive verbs in German by exploring their use with 'sich' in the dative form. We delve into when and how to employ 'sich' in the dative case. Additionally, we introduce a new connector in German - indem.

Session 20 (Interactive German: Part 13) Indem Übung

In this session, we reinforce our understanding of the concepts covered in the previous grammar session. We practice using sich in both accusative and dative cases, as well as integrating the new connector, indem. Through exercises, we acquire numerous useful structures and sentences applicable to our daily lives.

Session 21 (Interactive German: Part 14) Brief schreiben

In this session, we focus on writing letters and emails in German, preparing for the task of letter writing in the Telc exam. We learn the conventions for crafting both informal and semi-formal letters, including how to begin and end a letter, as well as how to structure it effectively for optimal impact.

Session 22 (Grammar) lassen als Hilfsverb

In this session, we delve into the final helping verb in German, lassen. This versatile verb serves two purposes in German and proves highly beneficial in our everyday conversations. We explore both contexts in which lassen is used and construct impactful sentences incorporating it.

Session 23 (Interactive German: Part 15) Zeit und Tätigkeiten

In today's session, we reflect on the significance of time in our lives. We contemplate the concepts of "saving time" and "wasting time" and explore the activities that consume the majority of our daily lives. Additionally, we identify opportunities where we can reclaim some free time. The aim is to enhance our vocabulary and expressions related to time management and daily activities.



Session 24 (Interactive German: Part 16) Umwelt

One of the most essential topics at the B1 level is the environment. We explore the components of the environment, various types of pollution prevalent in today's world, and the challenges humanity faces. Additionally, we discuss potential solutions to overcome these challenges, focusing on the context of Europe and Germany.

Session 25 (Grammar) Konjunktiv II

In this session, we introduce a new tense in German: Konjunktiv II (abbreviated as KII). Konjunktiv II is utilized in two main contexts: firstly, to express politeness in sentences, and secondly, to convey wishes. It is commonly employed in formal situations. Today, we delve into mastering this tense.

Session 26 (Interactive German: Part 17) Konjunktiv II Übung

This session is dedicated to practicing Konjunktiv II (K II). Here, we analyze various situations in our daily lives where K II is required. We learn the most commonly used sentences in such contexts. Through this practice, we aim to effortlessly express politeness and convey wishes and desires in German.

Session 27 (Interactive German: Part 18) Mündliche Prüfung Vorbereitung

In this session, we focus on preparing for the Oral Exam section of the Telc B1 Zertifikat Exam, which comprises three parts. In the first part, we acquaint ourselves with our partner, while in the second part, we express our opinions on specific topics. The third part involves engaging in a collaborative activity with our partner. We learn the most useful sentences for each of these three parts.



Session 28 (Grammar) Zweiteilige Konnektoren

In the final grammar session of B1, we explore two-way connectors. These connectors include phrases such as "either/or," "neither/nor," and "not only/but also," among others. They are utilized to enhance the expressiveness and interest of our language for the listener. We learn how to express these phrases in German.

Session 29 (Interactive German: Part 19) Zweiteilige Konnektoren Übung

This session assists in mastering the usage of two-way connectors. We engage in solving numerous exercises and tasks related to these connectors, exploring the various types of sentences that can be constructed using them.

Session 30 (Interactive German: Part 20) Hören Teil Prüfungsvorbereitung

This session is dedicated to understanding and practicing the Listening Section of the Telc B1 Zertifikat exam. This section consists of true/false exercises where we listen to an audio recording and mark whether statements are true or false based on the content of the audio. Today, we will solve one example of each type of exercise.

Session 31 (Grammar) Modeltest besprechen

This final session covers the format of the Telc B1 Zertifikat exam. We review the entire structure of the exam, including the allocation of points and time for each section. Additionally, we discuss helpful tricks and strategies to excel in the exam. With this session, the course concludes.

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
